Dr. Bennardo explained that teams of students from Stimson and Silas Wood were working with LI Stem Hub to investigate problems with

water on Long Island. Dr. Bennardo introduced Ms. Scardapane and the

students. Mr. Bilicki worked with the Stimson team who were

investigating storm water. Ms. Miller worked with the Silas Wood students who were investigating the drinking water. The Stimson and Silas Wood students took turns explaining their objective which was to

identify the problem, investigate the problem and come up with a solution. The students outlined the research that they had done. The Board and Cabinet were then asked to take a taste test of bottled and tap water. The students stated that the Board and Cabinet had picked the bottled water six out of nine which was a higher percentage than the students at Silas Wood where 40% of the students picked the bottled water. The students explained that South Huntington has been adding chlorine to their water which has affected the taste. The students stated that the next step was to continue to investigate the problems and then try to find a solution.

SHEF Family Fun Day Recognition:

SHEF President Charles Ciravolo noted that during the past couple of years SHEF had donated iPads and iPad carts, a rock climbing wall and last year a NAO Robot. Requests to Remain in South Huntington Schools:

Dr. Bennardo stated that the Board received requests from two families to remain in the school district. Dr. Bennardo noted that requests to remain in the school district usually come in during the second semester or are for students in their senior year. Dr. Bennardo stated that there was a delicate balance between responsibility to the taxpayers and the desire to offer our services to these families. Dr. Bennardo stated that it was his recommendation to allow all the students to remain in our school district through the holidays and only grant approval for the Grade 12 student at Walt Whitman High School to remain in South Huntington Schools for the remainder of the 2014-2015 school year. Dr. Bennardo stated that he would recommend that the parents register their younger children to begin in their new school districts after the holidays. After discussion, the Board took the following action:

Mr. Nitkewicz moved, with a second from Mrs. Brieff, to amend the resolution to allow all students to remain in South Huntington Schools through December 19, 2014, and to approve the request to allow the Grade 12 student to remain in South Huntington Schools for the remainder of the 2014-2015 school year; and be it further amended to deny the requests for the students in Grades 2, 7, 9 and 10 to remain in South Huntington Schools for the remainder of the 2014-2015 school year.

Be it Further Resolved that the Board of Education of the South Huntington Union Free School District does hereby deny the request for the students in Grade 2, 7, 9 and 10 to remain in South Huntington Schools for the remainder of the 2014-2015 school year, a copy of the requests made part of these legal minutes, p. 657-659. Motion, as amended, carried unanimously.
